FEATURED SPEAKER: LYNNE OLSON



In today's presentation, *New York Times*-bestselling author, Lynne Olson, will tell the engrossing behind-the-scenes story of how the United States and Britain forged their crucial World War II alliance, as seen from the viewpoint of three key Americans in wartime London: Edward R. Murrow, the pioneer journalist whose dramatic radio broadcasts rallied America to Britain's cause; Averell Harriman, the wealthy financier who ran FDR's Lend-Lease program in London; and John Gilbert Winant, the shy, idealistic U.S. ambassador to Britain. Biographer Walter Isaacson has called Olson's book, *Citizens of London*, "a triumph of research and storytelling...history on an intimate level."

Born in Hawaii, Olson graduated magna cum laude from the University of Arizona. Before becoming a full-time author, she worked as a journalist for ten years, first with the Associated Press as a national feature writer in New York, a foreign correspondent in AP's Moscow bureau, and a political reporter in Washington. She left the AP to join the Washington bureau of the *Baltimore Sun*, where she covered national politics and eventually the White House.

Olson is author of eight books on history, most of which deal in some way with World War II and Britain's crucial role in that conflict. Former U.S. Secretary of State Madeleine Albright has called Olson "our era's foremost chronicler of World War II politics and diplomacy." Her book, *Citizens of London*, was selected by the American Library Association as one of its top nonfiction books in 2010. It was also included on Amazon's list of best books of the year.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

On December 8, 2018 – exactly 77 years after America entered WWII, the Coastal Georgia Historical Society opened the World War II Home Front Museum on St. Simons. The 3,595 square-foot Home Front Museum—built in the refurbished Coast Guard Station and boathouse—tells the stories of Navy pilots, blimp crews, Civil Air Patrolmen, radar operators, shipyard workers, Coast Guardsmen, and civilians who united as a community to defend the coast and the nation from the ever-present threat of Axis attacks. Personal stories of these men, women and children who lived in Coastal Georgia at the time are told throughout the museum, using interviews, artifacts, documents, and photographs from the Society's collection.

So many have played a role in making this remarkable project possible. Their contributions range from sharing first-hand accounts of what happened to them or their families during WWII, to donating artifacts and photographs, or contributing to the construction, landscaping and other enhancements to create the beautiful and welcoming museum and campus. We are especially grateful to Glynn County for entrusting the historic buildings to our organization. December 8th was a celebration of the end of a four-year long project. However, it also marks the beginning of all that is to come in this iconic place. I am truly grateful to you for sharing our enthusiasm to tell this community's home front story.

Approximately 250 people attended the December 8th celebration including many who worked in the Liberty shipyards or trained at NAS Glynco or NAS St. Simons. Dr. Rob Citino, Senior Historian at the National World War II Museum spoke on the significance of the home front story. Dr. Citino served as consultant on the National World War II Museum's most recent project, The Arsenal of Democracy, which tells

the home front story from a national perspective. We have received many positive comments and messages from guests at the opening events, including many handwritten notes from people who gave first-hand accounts. A blog post on the King and Prince Beach & Golf Resort website says that, "December 2018 marks a monumental time for St. Simons Island with the opening of the World War II Home Front Museum. ...We had the honor of attending the private opening ceremonies December 8, 2018. As one of the most humbling opportunities, it was moving to be able to share the museum with the veterans and family members in attendance." (To read the complete blog, see <https://blog.kingandprince.com>.) Gallagher & Associates is featuring the new museum on their website. They said, "The museum has great stories and a big heart. Our partners were so passionate, dedicating every day for the past few years to bringing these inspiring local stories to life."

A U. S. Coast Guard Station built in 1937, which President Roosevelt transferred to the Department of the Navy in 1941, is at the heart of the story. This project has preserved the Historic Coast Guard Station and transformed it into a valuable cultural attraction on a par with the Lighthouse site. This museum tells the story of our community, in a time of worldwide war, the likes of which the world had never seen. This is the moment that the new museum seeks to recall, a moment in which democracy and freedom hung in the balance. Of course, we can multiply that "community" many times over, because every American household and every American community gave to the war effort, including the very lives of their own sons and daughters. Remarkably, in this community, the war became shockingly REAL, the enemy was HERE, and the contribution that Coastal Georgia offered was as concrete as any military engagement overseas.

Unabashedly, the Society approached the very best museum designers to create state of the art exhibits, which provide authentic and meaningful activities for visitors of all ages to learn about this critical period in our nation's history. Gallagher & Associates is the lead designer at the National WWII Museum in New Orleans and many other exceptional projects around the world. Gallagher assembled a top-notch team who brought enormous imagination, creativity and depth of experience to the project. 1220 Exhibits of Nashville, TN joined the team a year ago to bring the designs to life. 1220 Exhibits hired Silver Oaks Communications of Moline, IL shortly afterwards to produce the audio visual and interactive elements in the new museum.

Immersive galleries and interactive exhibits provide an engaging and educational experience for schoolchildren. The new museum recreates iconic home front scenes such as a bond drive booth and an A&P Food storefront for rationed products. Interactive experiences will allow schoolchildren and visitors of all ages to try their hand at plane spotting, directing fighter pilot squadrons using radar technology, and building and tracking the voyages of various Liberty ships built in Brunswick. Now that the new museum is open, our Education Director is developing a program to familiarize Glynn County teachers with the new exhibits. We are also reaching out to school systems throughout Georgia to make them aware of this valuable teaching tool, which closely aligns with state curriculum requirements. The Georgia State Curriculum requires students to learn the impact of World War II on the state and its role in World War II. The campus now includes facilities that will allow the museum to accommodate school groups, including an Education Pavilion, a dig area to host archaeology programs, and a detached restroom building.

In addition to schools, the new museum has created a platform for the Society to build partnerships with other museums across the state, region, and country. Working together with Scott Loehr, the President of the National Mighty Eighth Museum in Pooler, GA, we have plans to establish a military museum network across the state to provide specialized tours and programs for our members. The National World War II Museum, which is creating a national museum affiliates network to expand educational outreach, has interviewed us for their new initiative, launching in 2020. We are hopeful that these partnerships will increase visitation, enhance programming, and create valuable educational opportunities.

According to our research, Glynn County is the only county nationwide to operate three critical facilities during WWII: a Liberty shipyard, an airship base, and naval radar training facilities. We have an extraordinary story to tell! With your help, not only this community, but also thousands of visitors from across the nation, will now be able to visit the Home Front Museum and learn how Coastal Georgians joined communities across America to do their part in the global fight for democracy and freedom.

Programs, Lectures, and Events

The A.W. Jones Heritage Center serves as the venue for a full schedule of activities and lectures, as well as providing space for the Society's offices, archives, library, the Museum Store, and event rentals.

■ Society Senior Historian Buddy Sullivan, presented his annual six-week course, **"An Overview of Coastal Georgia's History,"** January 16 through February 20. The course attracted 116 participants.

■ **The Society's Annual Meeting** was held on January 21 in The Cloister Ballroom on Sea Island. Keynote speaker Donald L. Miller, Ph.D., presented a lecture entitled "Supreme City: Manhattan During the Jazz Age." Dr. Miller is an author, historian, professor of History at Lafayette College, and has hosted or co-produced more than thirty television documentaries. In a lecture based on his critically acclaimed book, *Supreme City: How Jazz Age Manhattan Gave Birth to Modern America*, Dr. Miller examined the transformative decade of the 1920s when New York City became the cultural and commercial center of the country. Over 250 members and guests were in attendance.

John "Jack" O'Hagan was awarded the Cunningham Bowl, and Irwin R. Berman, MD, was awarded the Rodriguez Service Award for extraordinary service to the Society. Three new board members were announced at the meeting: Jan Payne, Bill Stembler, and Mary Schellhorn.

■ For **Georgia History Day** on February 2, volunteer Cesar Rodriguez and Education Director Sandy Jensen presented a program about the Lighthouse to 4th graders at Oglethorpe Point Elementary School.

■ The St. Simons Lighthouse Museum participated in the Georgia History Festival's **Super Museum Sunday** on February 4 where we opened the museum free of charge.

■ The Society co-sponsored **National History Day** on March 8 with the Georgia Humanities Council and LaGrange College in partnership with Mercer University. Over the course of the school year, students selected a topic related to this year's theme, "Conflict and Compromise in History." The Coastal Georgia Regional Competition was hosted at the Liberty County Performing Arts Center and 200 students participated. The winners went on to compete in the state competition in Macon on April 21.

■ For the third annual **Journeys**, the Society continued the exploration of Georgia's barrier islands with Cumberland Island. On March 29, Lary Dilsaver, Ph.D., presented "Cumberland Island National Seashore: A History of Conservation Conflict" on the complex and fascinating process of converting a privately-owned refuge into a national seashore. There were 200 people in attendance. The field trip to Cumberland Island took place on April 11. The group of 52 people toured Plum Orchard and had the option to hike to the beach or Dungeness.

■ This spring, the Society hosted a fourth grade class from Frederica Academy for a children's history and archaeology program. The group of students took a field trip to the Lighthouse Museum and then spent time at the Cassina Garden Club's Tabby Slave Cabins participating in a mock dig and artifact analysis. The Society also partnered with the Cassina Garden Club for a Girl Scout patch program and mock dig session. A total of 32 school children participated.

■ Over 50 Society volunteers were honored at the annual **Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon** on April 17. Special recognition was given to those who dedicated over 100 hours of volunteer service in 2017. Those recognized were Larry Bacon, Myrna Crook, Nancy Jenkins, Patty Mallicote, Jack O'Hagan, Janis Rodriguez, and Robin White.

■ The Coast Guard Aids to Navigation Team, based at Naval Air Station Jacksonville, connected with our local Auxiliary Crew this past May to offer their solution to the lightbulb issue at our Lighthouse. They had recently transitioned the Amelia Island Lighthouse to a new system, and brought a pair of 1,000-watt halogen bulbs for our Lighthouse. The St. Simons Crew has since adapted the wiring to ensure that the backup lightbulb system works and that it can be hooked to a generator during electricity blackouts. Thanks to their innovation, the Lighthouse will continue to shine brightly!

■ The **Spring Membership Meeting** was held on May 10. Author Jim Jordan, presented "The Search for the Missing Letter-Book." Jordan discussed the discovery of slave trader Charles Lamar's long-lost letter book and his research on the slave ship *Wanderer*. There were 200 members in attendance.

■ The **Little Light Music Concert Series** opened on May 13 with the Tams, followed by Loose Chain on June 10. The Funk Brotherhood performed on July 1, and the Sensational Sounds of Motown closed the season on September 2.

The Series entertained 5,000 concertgoers and generated around \$40,000 for the Society. We are grateful to our generous sponsors: Brown-Rose Wealth Management of Morgan Stanley, *Elegant Island Living*, Moore Stephens Tiller, Parker's Convenience Stores, Sea Island Landscaping, and Sea Island Properties.

■ The **2018 Chautauqua Lecture Series, For Better, For Worse: Exploring History Through Four Compelling Relationships**, focused on historically significant couples with ties to Coastal Georgia and examined the challenges they faced during their lives together. The series attracted 200 attendees per lecture.

The series began on **August 2** with a lecture from historian Steven C. Hahn, Ph.D., titled, "Branded and Stigmatized: Mary Musgrove and Thomas Bosomworth." Dr. Hahn's talk was based on his biography, *The Life and Times of Mary Musgrove*, and he unraveled the story of one of colonial Georgia's most fascinating characters. Dr. Hahn is a professor of history and department chair at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. He holds a master's degree from the University of Georgia and a doctorate from Emory University.

On **August 9**, Daniel Kilbride, Ph.D., presented "A Marriage Not Made in Heaven: Fanny Kemble and Pierce Butler." Dr. Kilbride discussed the ill-fated marriage of Fanny Kemble to Pierce Mease Butler and his book, *An American Aristocracy: Southern Planters in Antebellum Philadelphia*. Dr. Kilbride received his Ph.D. from the University of Florida and is professor of history at John Carroll University near Cleveland, Ohio.

At the third lecture on **August 16**, Canadian author Ken Whyte explored Presidential couple Herbert and Lou Hoover. Whyte discussed the Hoover's visit to Coastal Georgia in 1930 and examined the 31st president's remarkable career. Revered for organizing major relief efforts in Europe during World War I, Hoover was later maligned as president during the Great Depression. At his side in good times and bad was his wife Lou, an accomplished person in her own right. The couple had met at Stanford University, where Mrs. Hoover graduated as the only female geology major. Whyte is the former editor-in-chief of *Maclean's* magazine and author of *The Uncrowned King: The Sensational Rise of William Randolph Hearst*, a Washington Post Book of the Year.

The series closed on **August 23** with a lecture titled "Getting Away from It All: Maxfield and Lydia Parrish, from New Hampshire to Georgia," by Sylvia Yount. Yount detailed the relationship between American artist Maxfield Parrish and his wife Lydia. In the early 20th century, St. Simons Island became a seasonal refuge for Lydia Parrish. She became devoted to the preservation of the Gullah Geechee musical heritage, publishing the landmark *Slave Songs of the Georgia Sea Islands* in 1942. Yount is the Lawrence A. Fleishman Curator in Charge of the American Wing at the Metropolitan Museum of Art and organized a major exhibition on Maxfield Parrish, with accompanying catalog, for the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts in Philadelphia. She holds a Ph.D. and an M.A. in the history of art from the University of Pennsylvania.

The Society is grateful to Wells Fargo Advisors for their generous financial support of the Chautauqua Lecture Series.

■ **Community Day** is normally held in November, but the Society did not have the event this year due to preparations for the opening of the World War II Home Front Museum.

■ The **Fall Membership Meeting** was held on November 8. Jamil Zainaldin, Ph.D. presented "World War I: Georgia's Second Great War" in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of World War I. Dr. Zainaldin, former President of the Georgia Humanities, discussed the impact of the conflict on Georgia. There were 200 guests in attendance.

■ The Museum Store hosted a **Holiday Open House** on November 17.

■ The **World War II Home Front Museum** opened on Saturday, December 8. In celebration of the grand opening, the Society hosted four special events. On Thursday, December 6, a donor appreciation reception was held for major donors. On Friday, December 7, all Society members were invited to drop by and tour the Museum. Later that day, there was an open house for Keepers of the Light. The opening celebration for those involved in helping create the Museum was held on Saturday, December 8 from 10 a.m. – 12 p.m. The event included remarks from Patrick Gallagher, keynote speaker Rob Citino, Ph.D., Senior Historian of the National World War II Home Front Museum, and a champagne launch to open the Museum featuring Mimi Rogers and Ida Mae Lawson. The Museum opened to the public at 1 p.m. A total of 650 guests attended the events.

■ The Society presented "**SSI Archives**" each month in *Elegant Island Living* magazine. Produced by Mimi Rogers and Sandy Jensen, these articles on local history featured photographs and artifacts from our collection.

The laboratory at the Historic Coast Guard Station continues to be a valuable asset for the study and preservation of local archaeological collections, making it possible for the artifacts to stay on the Island and available to researchers. Former intern Marie Meranda returned to help in the lab in January thru March and in October.

The Golden Isles Archaeological Society continues to provide financial support to operations. Our outstanding volunteers not only contribute their time, but also support our activities by donating materials, supplies, and funds. Donations included \$5,700 from John O'Hagan to fund internship stipends and operational needs, as well as numerous in-kind supplies, and \$1,400 from Janis Rodriguez for the internship fund. Carbon dating for a Cannon's Point research project was funded by a \$2,500 donation from Brett and Sandy Harper and by two anonymous gifts, one for \$1,000 and one for \$250. Don Meaders donated many supplies to keep the lab up and running.

Society board member, Myrna Crook, has donated hundreds of hours to managing the lab and providing educational and research services. Our consulting archaeologist, Dr. Nicholas Honerkamp, has provided guidance and advice during the year. Five new collections were added in 2018. A strategic review will be undertaken in 2019 to set goals for the lab and archaeology programming.

Projects during the year have included:

- Processing and curation of materials found during projects at Cannon's Point Preserve
- Cleaning artifacts related to the James Oglethorpe home site on Federal property near Fort Frederica
- Expansion of the metal preservation program
- Maintaining a database of all artifacts
- Updating portable display cases for education programs and creating poster displays
- Providing support and information to two graduate students
- Assisting with a mock dig for Frederica Academy students
- Working with Cassina Garden Club on Girl Scout projects
- Relocating the archaeology lab to the basement of the Coast Guard Station.
- Providing numerous educational services to local organizations, including Cannon's Point Preserve, the St. Simons Land Trust Live Oak Society, and Fort Frederica.
