It's in the "Scrip"

The Stock Market Crash of 1929 caused thousands of people to lose their investments and billions of dollars. This period of time is known as the Great Depression. Many people were unemployed and had little confidence in financial institutions. Banks closed, causing a shortage of cash. Because of the shortage of cash, businesses such as Sea Island Company paid their employees in "scrip." Scrip was a type of currency that could only be used at local stores. People used scrip to buy things they needed.

the scrip, and what it could be used for.
