## **Gazebo and Oceanfront Lawn**

With views of the Atlantic Ocean, this is a perfect spot for relaxing and photo-taking. It's also the setting for the Society's series of summer music concerts.

Oil House In 1890, this brick oil house was constructed to hold the cans containing fuel for the lighthouse's kerosene lamp. The beam was converted to electricity in 1934.

The Keeper's Dwelling Built in 1872 as the home for lightkeepers until the 1950s, this two-story Victorian structure serves today as the St. Simons Lighthouse Museum.

The St. Simons Lighthouse Also built in 1872, the lighthouse stands 104-feet tall. Spectacular, panoramic vistas of the coast are well worth the 129-step, spiral staircase climb to its top!

## The A.W. Jones Heritage Center

The Center was built in 2008 and includes:

- Museum Store
- Admission Ticket Sales for the Lighthouse Museum (After purchasing tickets, follow the • • • • line at left from the Museum Store to the Keeper's Dwelling and Lighthouse)
- Orientation Theater (Accessed through the Museum Store)
- Event Hall Available for weddings, receptions and private events.
- Administrative Offices of the Coastal Georgia Historical Society (second floor). Access to the Society's historic archives and research facilities is available by appointment only.
