FIRST OVAL OFFICE PROJECT



- A week-long Semiquincentennial festival for Georgians to explore and experience the history of the American Revolution on the Coast.
- The main event of RC250 is the weekend's First Oval Office Project of the Museum of the American Revolution, which will bring a replica of General George Washington's Revolutionary War tent—the mobile command center of the Continental Army—directly to Georgians. The project also includes several other tents, like “common” soldiers’ tents and a dining tent, as well as costumed interpreters that will reveal the range of experiences for those who served and sacrificed during the Revolutionary War.
 - This will be the first time this special program has visited the state of Georgia, providing a wonderful opportunity for our state’s citizens to engage with the important history of the American Revolution.
- RC250 will be free and open to the public on Saturday, March 14 and Sunday, March 15; Friday, March 13, is reserved for school tours by local students. Weekday programming will be priced per event.

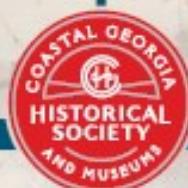

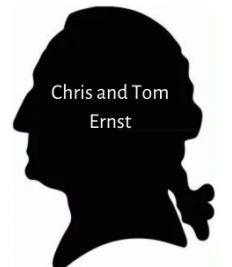

In 1965, a small group of local residents formed Coastal Georgia Historical Society with an ambitious vision: to lead in the preservation of the artifacts and buildings that are the treasures of our coastal heritage. The Society's mission -- "to connect people to Coastal Georgia's dynamic history through the stories we share and the collections we preserve" -- guides us as we present and interpret our past for
