REVOLUTION on the COAST

A 250th
CELEBRATION

Coastal Georgia Historical Society invites history lovers of all ages for a special Semiquincentennial experience. Explore the historic and scenic Golden Isles of Georgia during this weekend of unique local events. Participants can take advantage of two signature events scheduled in mid-March 2026:

⇒ **Revolution on the Coast: A 250th Celebration.** From March 9 through 15, 2026, locals and visitors alike will experience and explore the American Revolution through engaging and interactive programs. The main event is the First Oval Office Project of the Museum of the American Revolution, which over the weekend of March 14, & 15 will bring a replica of George Washington's Revolutionary War tent—the mobile command center of the Continental Army—to St. Simons Island. The project also includes other tents like common soldiers' tents and a dining tent, as well as costumed interpreters, that will reveal the experiences of those who served and sacrificed during the war. **Saturday and Sunday are free and open to the public but registration is required at www.coastalgeorgiahistory.org/RC250.** Additional programming throughout the week is priced individually:

⇒ The **2026 Christ Church Annual Tour of Homes**, will feature "*Lifestyles Around the Lodge*" with homes in the never-before-on-tour communities surrounding the Lodge at Sea Island Golf Club at

the south end of St. Simons! Parking and transportation for the annual Tour of Homes will again be based at Christ Church, Frederica with refreshments in the Parish Hall and the opportunity to visit to the historic church, cemetery and labyrinth. **This popular event requires the purchase of a ticket and may sell out in advance.**

Other unique attractions on the coast to enjoy:

- √ No visit to the Golden Isles is complete without a visit to the iconic [St. Simons Lighthouse Museum](#) and Keeper's Dwelling. Climb the 129 steps of the Lighthouse tower for enchanting views of the barrier islands.
- √ Learn about Coastal Georgia's role and extraordinary contributions to winning the Second World War at the [World War II Home Front Museum](#) housed in the Historic St. Simons Coast Guard Station. Test your skills as a plane spotter, build a Liberty Ship, or learn radar techniques at this interactive museum experience.
- √ Come inside the last remaining African American one-room schoolhouse on the Georgia coast – originally known as the Harrington Graded School, constructed in 1924. The [Historical Harrington School Cultural Center](#) is the headquarters for the St. Simons African American Heritage Coalition.
- √ [Glynn Visual Arts \(GVA\)](#) is a nonprofit visual arts center founded in 1953 and located on St. Simons Island, serving Coastal Georgia. Stop by for a class or to view the work of local artists.
- √ Drive over the Sydney Lanier Bridge to visit [Jekyll Island](#). This 5,500-acre island is home to 10 miles of shoreline and a variety of events, family-friendly activities, and attractions. From the iconic Driftwood Beach to the island's National Historic Landmark district and Jekyll Island Club, the Georgia Sea Turtle Center, and more.
