



ARCHIVAL AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL COLLECTIONS

Located in the A.W. Jones Heritage Center, the Society's archival collection of over 15,000 primary source materials includes manuscripts, photographs, rare books, oral histories, videos, maps, paintings, and artifacts related to the Coastal Georgia region, dating from the 18th to the 20th century.

Much of CGHS's archival collection is searchable through our online collection found at coastalgeorgiahistory.pastperfectonline.com. On-site and virtual research assistance is available, as well as photographic reproduction services. The archives are available for research at the CGHS Research Library by appointment, Monday-Friday from 10am-4:30pm.

CGHS also operates an archaeology lab, headquartered in our World War II Home Front Museum at the Historic Coast Guard Station at East Beach. This lab curates over fifty archaeological collections, encompassing thousands of artifacts, all of which originate from the Coastal Georgia region. Collections curated at the lab have been highlighted in professional publications, academic papers, master's theses, and conferences. These collections are also available for research, by appointment, Monday-Friday from 10am-4:30pm.
